






#### **CA Population 1990 - 2060**

California is projected to add 10 million new residents by 2050.




The population in 2050 will be more diverse, and older...



#### **CA Population by Age**




#### **CA Annual Permits 2001 - 2016**

California has the highest rate of unsheltered homeless in the nation.


**EXHIBIT 1.7: States with the Highest and Lowest Rates of Unsheltered People Experiencing Homelessness**







#### Jobs per Capita Projected Housing Growth




#### Bay Area Growth in "Supercommuters" 2009-2017

## Housing + Transportation Costs As Percentage of Total Income


Transportation adds to household cost burden – particularly in lower-density locations.


Housing @ 30% Income

Housing + Transportation @ 45% Income




#### California GHG Emissions by Sector

Transportation accounts for over half of GHG emissions.




## Per capita miles driven (VMT) is going in the wrong direction.

## CO<sub>2</sub> and Vehicle Miles Traveled Per Capita 2000 - 2015




#### Fresno Metro Area Land Conversion



#### RHNA Statutory Objectives

- Increase housing supply & mix of housing types, tenure & affordability in an equitable manner
- Promote infill development & socioeconomic equity, protect environmental & ag resources, & encourage efficient development patterns (the State "planning priorities")
- Promote improved intraregional jobs-housing relationship including jobs housing fit
- Balance disproportionate household income distributions (more lower income RHNA to higher income areas and vice-versa)
- Affirmatively furthering fair housing
